
Borke - Structure in Perfection


Inspired by the unique and distinctive designs of the natural world, the creation of BORKE opens up a whole new dimension.

With never before seen precision, real wood veneers are pressed into a structure with the appearance of the gnarled bark of an old tree. So arises a play of light and shade, a composition of look and feel. The high precision as well as the exceptional depth of the structure generate a one-of-a-kind sculptural presence.

The presence of this structure creates an atmosphere of familiarity; it serves as a reminder of the complex, true structures that can only be found in Nature.

The standard panel measures 2450x1050x21mm and can be used as a wall panel, in furniture and as cladding.






BORKE – panel

The grooves create calm and form an orderly pattern that calms the vitality of the structure. Whether horizontal or vertical, rectangle or square, uniform or irregular patterns, there are no limits to your creativity.

The grooves have no function of stability or structure.
All veneer layers except for the top layer are solid-coloured black veneers.
This means the surface can easily be textured by milling or sawing.

The following pages contain information on how to do this.



BORKE – texturing the surface with grooves

- Before processing, the front of the panel should be pre-lacquered once to prevent possible damage.
- Grooves at the edges can be made with a milling machine. The tool should be directed along the front side.

 Test beforehand to establish the correct milling depth for your requirements.
- Grooves in the surface, both with and against the grain, can made using a circular saw.
- Here too the tool should be directed along the pre-lacquered front side.
- By such simple means you can create horizontal, vertical or patterns of grooves.
- Small materials defects or those caused during processing can be easily re-touched with a black touch-up applicator.

BORKE – linear

Furniture frontals and facings as a linear structure.

The composition of light and shade is increased by the texture and colour of the veneer.





BORKE – in mosaic pattern, uniform or irregular.

Accentuate surfaces by rearranging elements of the structure into a regular or an uneven pattern. Turning the elements so that the structure and the veneer are at 90 degree angles increases the effect.
